받침(batchim) should be put at the bottom and pronounced at the end of Korean syllable block. When writing, you can use all 19 consonants and mixed consonants for 받침 but they can have only 7 sounds [ㄱ, ㄴ, ㄷ, ㄹ, ㅁ, ㅂ, ㅇ] which are k, n, t, l, m, p, ng.
